Major Specific Notes | Elementary Education

The majority of requirements on this checklist are mandated by the Illinois State Board of Education. Changes in state licensure requirements must be met at the time they go into effect. Therefore, this could change program requirements, requiring different courses than those listed on the checklist. See your academic advisor with questions regarding this.

The Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP) and the ACT with Writing or SAT used in lieu of TAP are valid for 10 years. All other exams required for licensure are valid for five years from the date of successful passage.

Elementary Education major majors must submit at least 33 semester credit hours within the department, excluding student teaching, 30 semester credit hours at the 200 level or above (including 15 semester credit hours at the 300 level); grades of 'C" or better.

A cumulative GPA of a 2.75 and a 3.0 GPA in the major are required for Teacher Education Programs. GPA is based on Benedictine University courses only.

- C minus grades (C-) or lower are considered to be grades below a "C."

If MATH 222 is not completed with a grade of "C" or better, the student must then take both MATH S112 and 222 and earn grades of "C" or better in both courses.
