The certificate programs at Benedictine University are an excellent way to gain that competitive edge in your profession. Accountants looking to fulfill the new requirements to sit for the Certified Public Accountant (C.P.A.) exam will find our accounting certificates invaluable. Those students deciding to continue in the Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.) or Master of Science in Accountancy (M.S.A.) programs may be able to apply certificate credits to a degree program at a later date.

Program Overview

Two 16 credit-hour certificates are offered in Accounting for those advancing toward C.P.A. status. These courses may be counted toward fulfillment of the Illinois C.P.A. Society 150-hour rule, and provide a concentrated sequence in accounting courses. They may also be applied toward the Accounting concentration for degree-seeking M.B.A. or M.S.A. students.
