## THE BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A.) IN MANAGEMENT PROGRAM AT BENEDICTINE UNIVERSITY is designed to

fully prepare students to effectively manage business within an organization. Challenging courses guide and hone key skills managers need to be successful, including project management, technology integration, financial accounting, communication, risk assessment and management, strategy and decision-making.

The program helps prepare future leaders through engaging instruction and analyses in the areas of applied microeconomics, marketing, human resource management, group dynamics and learning strategies, finite mathematics and ethical leadership. Students master the ability to analyze, implement and manage solutions to corporate sustainability issues, including fiscal responsibility, resource management and organizational strategy development.

All courses are based on adult learning principles and are delivered in a blended format that combines the most effective aspects of live instruction with self-directed online learning. The B.A. in Management is offered in an evening accelerated learning team format providing students with the knowledge, skills and creative problem-solving ability demanded by today's modern workplace.

Students also enjoy the benefits of a strong, values-based education with all the convenience of an adult learner setting.

With transferred credit hours, major coursework and completion of graduation requirements (including major cognate and core courses and electives), most students finish the B.A. degree completion in Management program in about two years or less.

Students may also pursue a concentration or academic certificate in Marketing or Human Resources Management through online coursework, along with an option for work/life credits, to fulfill any remaining elective requirements upon advisement.
