## **Tuition Refund Policy for Graduate, Cohorts and Professional Education Students**

- Student may drop from a course up to 7 calendar days after the first class meeting for a full refund.
- Student dropping from a course 8 calendar days or more after the first class meeting will receive no refund.
- Courses that have a condensed meeting schedule will have no refund available after the first class meeting.
- All drops must be done in writing to your academic advisor.
- 1. Notifying the instructor that you want to drop a course does not officially withdraw a student from a course.
- 2. Non-attendance in a course will not constitute a drop.
- 3. Students who do not officially drop a course will be financially responsible for the entire cost of the course.
- 4. Students who are expelled or suspended from the University during the course of an academic term are responsible for all financial obligations.

**Note:** Course/Program withdrawal must be in writing to your academic advisor. The date of notification will be used for tuition adjustment calculations.

**Caution:** For financial aid recipients, dropping a course or withdrawing from the program may result in your aid being returned back to the lender or the grant source. This may cause your account to have a debit balance with the university which must be repaid. Please consult with your financial aid counselor before withdrawing from courses.

Note: The University reserves the right to change its tuition rate and fees without further notice. In addition, University policies and procedures may change at any time.
