Coursework must include BIOL 197(3) or 297(4), 198(3), 199(1), 229(3), 250(3), 251(1), 340(3), 341(1), 363(3), 364(1); CHEM 113(3), 114(1), 123(3), 124(1), 242(3), 243(1), 247(3), 248(1); PHYS 113(3), 114(1), 118(3), 119(1); MATH 111(3), 210 (5) or 220(5) or proficiency in MATH 210 or higher; BCHM 261(3) or 361(3).
