



The Department of Homeland Security and the U.S. Department of Education regulations require students to provide valid citizenship documentation prior to releasing federal funds to the student's account. If the student is selected for citizenship verification, the student must provide the documentation **In-Person** or submit a **Certified Notarized form**.

The student must bring an original document In-Person to BU Office of Financial Aid or to Notary Public official, as acceptable proof of citizenship.

- Your U.S. Certificate of Birth; **or**
- Your signed U.S. Passport or U.S. Passport Card; **or**
- Your signed Certificate of Naturalization; **or**
- Your signed Certificate of Citizenship; **or**
- Your unexpired Permanent Resident Card (I-551) from the USCIS; **or**
- Your Conditional Permanent Resident with a Conditional Green Card (I-551C); **or**
- Your Resident Alien Card (I-551); **or**
- Your Alien Registration Receipt Card (I-151); **or**
- Your Arrival-Departure Record (I-94) from the Department of Homeland Security showing any of the following designations: Refugee, Asylum Granted, Parolee, (I-94 confirms that you were paroled for a minimum of one year and status has not expired), T-Visa holder (T-1, T-2, T-3, etc.) or Cuban-Haitian Entrant; **or**
- Your valid certification or eligibility letter from the Department of Health and Human Services showing a designation of "Victim of human trafficking."
